

GROUP SCENES for YOUNG ACTORS

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SCENES

NOTE: All roles are gender-neutral, unless indicated otherwise in the stage directions preceding the scene.

DAYDREAMING (5 Actors)

(JAY lays on the ground looking up at the sky happily. DYLAN enters.)

DYLAN: Hey, Jay. What're you doing?

JAY: Daydreaming.

DYLAN: Have you been doing this all day?

JAY: I haven't been paying attention to the time, but yeah, I think I've been up here a while.

DYLAN: Aren't you bored?

JAY: I don't think so.

DYLAN: Well then aren't you lonely? Sitting there all by yourself?

JAY: I'm not alone. I'm with my friend, Porky the porcupine.

(DYLAN notices PORKY who magically appears at JAY's feet.)

PORKY: Hi. I'm Porky.

DYLAN: AH!! Where'd you come from?!

JAY: And I have my memories.

(LITTLE JAY enters looking for something.)

LITTLE JAY: Hi. I'm six-year-old Jay. I lost my sweater at the zoo. Can you help me find it?

DYAN: Woah!! What?! How!?

LITTLE JAY: I don't know how. That's what I'm trying to figure out.

PORKY: I'll help!

LITTLE JAY: Thanks!

(LITTLE JAY and PORKY wander away, looking for the sweater.)

JAY: And, of course, I have my future aspirations and dreams.

(BIG JAY enters)

BIG JAY: I am future Jay, and I have just discovered the cure for the common cold!(*BIG JAY sneezes*) *Ah choo!* I think it needs some more work. Back to my laboratory on Mars!

(BIG JAY gets to work in their lab, experimenting with different medicines.)

DYLAN: What's going on!? Where are we!?

JAY: We're in my imagination! Behind the largest waterfall and down the road from the watermelon orchard.

BIG JAY: And also on Mars!

LITTLE JAY: And at the zoo!

DYLAN: Ah! Waterfall! I'm all wet! It's spraying everywhere!

(PORKY offers DYLAN a towel.)

PORKY: Do you want a towel? I weave them out of porcupine quills. Careful. They're sharp.

DYLAN: This doesn't make any sense! Porcupines don't talk and they don't weave!

BIG JAY: Not yet, but in the year 2060 they will. Hey, Little Jay, I found your sweater!

(BIG JAY hands LITTLE JAY their sweater.)

LITTLE JAY: Behind the lions' cage. I should looked there!

PORKY: Hi lions!

DYLAN: Oh no! Lions!

JAY: Oh, don't worry. They're friendly. Anyway, what did you ask me? Oh right! Am I bored? Um, not really. Why? Are you?

LIBRARY #1 (4 Actors)

(Note: In this version, ASH is played by a girl. See version #2 if ASH is played by a boy.)

(MORGAN and KENDALL study together in the library, while LONDON sits nearby. They scribble silently for a while, then MORGAN speaks in a hushed whisper.)

MORGAN: Can I borrow your eraser?

KENDALL: Here you go.

LONDON: Sh!

MORGAN: Sorry.

(They go back to working. After a moment, KENDALL drums their fingers on the desk.)

LONDON: Sh!

KENDALL: Sorry. I'll stop.

(KENDALL stops drumming their fingers. They continue working in silence. After a moment, LONDON sneezes quietly.)

LONDON: Achoo!

KENDALL & MORGAN: Bless you.

LONDON: Sh!

KENDALL: Seriously?

(They go back to working in silence. ASH enters loudly and speaks to KENDALL and MORGAN.)

ASH: I've been looking for you two everywhere!

LONDON, KENDALL, & MORGAN: Sh!

ASH: Woah. What's the problem?

MORGAN (*whispering*): It's the library. We have to be quiet.

ASH: But, I have news! (LONDON shoots ASH a scathing look.) Yikes. Okay. Fine. I won't talk.

(For the rest of the scene, ASH, MORGAN, and KENDALL gesture silently to one another like charades. All of the bracketed text is unspoken.)

KENDALL: [What's your news!?]

MORGAN: [Careful! London's gonna get mad!]

KENDALL: [London's oblivious.]

(They look at LONDON who, indeed, appears oblivious, consumed in their work.)

MORGAN: [Okay. Go ahead. What's the news!?]

ASH: [I got the lead in the school play! I'm going to be Belle!]

KENDALL: [What!?]

MORGAN: [Huh?!]

ASH: [I'm going to be Belle in Beauty and The Beast. Beauty. Beast. Beauty. Beast. I'm Beauty!]

KENDALL: [What's she saying?]

MORGAN: [No idea.]

ASH: [I'm going to sing and dance and be the star of the show! I'll read all the books and fall in love with the Beast and save the day!]

KENDALL: [You're sick?]

ASH: [No!]

MORGAN: [You're getting a makeover?]

ASH: [No! Ugh!]

(LONDON slams her book shut.)

LONDON: Isn't it obvious!? (MORGAN and KENDALL shake their heads. LONDON speaks loudly and clearly while mimicking the movements Ash just displayed.) She's going to be the lead in the school play! She's going to be Belle in Beauty and the Beast! Beauty. Beast. Beauty. Beast. She's Beauty. She's going to sing and dance and be the star of the show! She'll read books and fall in love with the Beast and save the day!

ASH: [That's it! That's it!]

(ASH, KENDALL, and MORGAN jump up and down in silent celebration.)

KENDALL & MORGAN: [Yay! Congrats! Hooray!]

LONDON: I gotta find another place to study.

NIGHT TIME (5 Actors)

(TYLER sits up in bed and calls to their parents off-stage.)

TYLER: Goodnight! (*TYLER turns off the light.*) Just close your eyes and go to sleep. You got this.

(ANXIETY enters)

ANXIETY: Did you remember to do all of your homework?

TYLER: What? Uh, yeah. I think so.

ANXIETY: But did you do a good job? Do you think it's perfect? It should be perfect, right?

What if it's not perfect?

TYLER: I tried really hard.

ANXIETY: Hard enough?

TYLER: I don't know.

(REGRET enters.)

REGRET: Why did you tell the teacher you were afraid of flying today? That was a pretty weird

thing to say. I think she rolled her eyes when you said it.

TYLER: I... I wish I didn't say that.

(FEAR enters.)

FEAR: Airplanes are terrifying! You should be afraid of flying! It's not natural for humans to fly!

(CRITICISM enters.)

CRITICISM: Don't be a wuss. Stop being so scared of everything.

TYLER: Sorry. I -

ANXIETY: Uh oh. You're not sleeping. You should be sleeping. It's getting really late.

TYLER: I'm trying!

ANXIETY: When you don't sleep enough you get sick.

FEAR: Oh no! Not sick! You hate being sick!

REGRET: You didn't sleep last night either. You should have gone to bed earlier.

CRITICISM: Just close your eyes and go to sleep like a normal person!

ANXIETY: Oh no! What if we're not normal?

TYLER: Please! Just let me be! I can't take this!

FEAR: We can't just go away. We're your thoughts! We're always here.

TYLER: But I need a break. I need a break!

CRITICISM: Well, how are you gonna get a break when you can't tame your own mind!? Loser.

TYLER: Hey! That's not a very nice thing to say.

CRITICISM: You thought it!

TYLER: So what? That doesn't make it true!

(Silence.)

ANXIETY: Woah. Good point.

FEAR: I never thought of it that way.

TYLER: I hear you. But I don't have to believe you. And I don't have to answer to you all the

time.

FEAR: Where are we supposed to go!?

TYLER: Well, I imagine you'll stick around, but I'm just gonna breathe and rest for a while.

CRITICISM: But you're not good at that! You're so bad at falling asleep!

(TYLER takes a deep breath.)

TYLER (calmly): Okay.

CRITICISM: Did you hear me?

TYLER: I hear you.

CRITICISM: Don't you agree? Shouldn't you worry about it? Or don't you, at least, wanna

argue?

TYLER: Nah, I'm good.

CRITICISM: Huh. That's new.

REGRET: I do feel sort of sleepy.

FEAR: I suppose I could use a nap. But I'll be back and I have lots to say!

(TYLER yawns.)

TYLER: I know. That's fine. Goodnight.

ANXIETY: Goodnight.

(They all go to sleep.)

PIGEONS (5 Actors)

(Five pigeons in a park. They bob their heads back and forth as pigeons do and prance through the park, flapping their wings.)

BUDDY: Ladies, Gentlemen. It's wonderful to see you.

KIWI: Indeed! You're looking quite dapper today.

PEPPER: Beautiful feathers. Pristine.

BUDDY: Why thank you. I bathed in puddle water just this morning.

TANGO: Ah, and which puddle water did you select?

BUDDY: Only the best.

ORVILLE: Ah?

BUDDY: Muddy puddle water.

ALL: Wow.

ORVILLE: Very nice! It does show.

BUDDY: And you're looking particularly regal today, Orville. Is that... sewage I smell?

ORVILLE: Good nose, lad! The finest sewage from the New York subway system. I used it for my talon pedicure this morning.

TANGO: Marvelous!

PEPPER: The subway is a delightful spa. I visited once and exfoliated my beak with the steam coming up from the platform.

TANGO: How indulgent!

(KIWI spots something and shrinks away.)

KIWI: Oh no. Not again.

BUDDY: Whatever is the matter?

KIWI: Humans approaching.

(All of the pigeons scuttle away in fear. They watch the humans from afar.)

ORVILLE: Filthy creatures.

BUDDY: The way they move.

TANGO: Awkward.

BUDDY: Their bodies.

KIWI: So lanky.

PEPPER: And they take up the entire street, as if they don't care that we're here!

BUDDY: Oh no, they're getting close!

TANGO: Stay away, humans!

ORVILLE: Too close! Too close! Let's go! Fly! Fly!

(The pigeons all take flight. Leaving the stage)

(After a moment, KIWI re-enters, cautiously looking around.)


KIWI: I think they're gone.
